We're pleased to share that most of the temporary fencing around the school grounds will be removed later today or by Monday morning. This marks an exciting step forward in reopening the oval and surrounding areas for student use. However, after inspecting the area near the parent car park entry, a few staff and school council members have identified a particularly muddy section. To ensure safety and maintain the space, we'll be keeping some temporary fencing in place around this area until our new sandpit and gymnastics bar sets are installed. This will also give us time to complete landscaping works, plant lawn seed and allow the area to recover. We're looking forward to full access to the oval, as well as the new footpath and learning building from next week. See the photo attached to this newsletter outlining where the new fencing will go.

As part of our ongoing commitment to cultural understanding and inclusion, we are currently exploring opportunities to feature the work of Aboriginal Artists throughout our school. We are continuing our focus on student wellbeing through two important programs: *The Resilience Project* and *Respectful Relationships*. These initiatives are embedded in classroom learning and play a key role in supporting our students' emotional and social development.




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Harmonica Incursion



On Tuesday our Grade 3-6 students participated in a harmonica incursion with professional harpist Chris Maunders from 'Harp's a Breeze'. Wow! What a fantastic musician and teacher Chris is ! He played us some brilliant music and told us all about the instrument. The kids were particularly impressed with Chris' collection which included the world's smallest and largest harmonicas. Chris showed everyone how to play the instrument, with a few special techniques such as trills and vibrato and how to read harmonica charts. Students have been very inspired to play their new harmonicas; the school grounds have been humming with the sound of them at recess and lunch. The instruments and books will stay at school for a couple of weeks whilst students continue with this unit of work in their music classes. After this, they can take their harmonicas home.
